






CCFL INTERMEDIATE IN SWAHILI ARE PRINTED



Missionary Ernie Hopper reports that ICP translator has completed several *Character Code for Life* modules. Pictured above are the first two modules of eighteen lessons each which have been printed in the Swahili language for churches in Kenya, Tanzania and South Sudan.

We are blessed to have Moses Wanjala translating for ICP. He also translates books and other things for Brother Hopper. He has translated several other modules of *CCfL* which we have had funding to print. Before *CCfL* was produced, Moses translated

other materials for ICP. We printed thousands of these books, both for children and adults. Several missionaries joined to distribute the books among more than one hundred churches.

The people of Kenya readily respond to the gospel message, creating a tremendous need for literature to train children to walk in the way of our Lord Jesus Christ. To our knowledge, ICP remains the only source of biblically sound curriculum materials in the Swahili language.

Intermediate (grades 4-6) students' leaflets are much more detailed; their activities challenge their thinking and provide great application material. *CCfL* leaders enjoy the materials which have become an important component of the Christian education ministry of First Baptist.

We love how it is interactive and the repetitiveness of having the same Bible verse for three weeks in a row is allowing them to really learn it and take something away from it.

Personal Salary Support. I know I say it a lot, but it is such a blessing to be well funded and able to stay focused on the work of completing our nine-year Character Code for Life curriculum. I have finished editing the student materials for our final module for all three age groups. It was my goal to have that much completed before my 65th birthday (February 7). Goal reached! Now, on to the task of editing the Teacher Instruction books before Easter.

Volunteer Writer Support. All our children's CCfL lessons were written by volunteers, all but one were experienced educators. Recently, three of these writers have been going the extra mile to help me: thank you Brenda Jackson, Texas, Carolyn Daniel, Alabama, and Leah Wright, Arkansas. We have also been so blessed with volunteer proofreaders; even our Spanish language translator, Brother Gabriel Sanchez, Texas, volunteers his time. Please pray for our wonderful typesetters/graphic design artists who are preparing the final material for print.

ICP Ministry Support. Brother Bill Johnson and I are so thankful for the financial support that provides funding to pay foreign translators and the printing of Character Code for Life material into seven foreign languages. Approximately 53,000 18-week studies (Intermediate leaflets, Primary cards and journals, and Preschool placemats) have been printed and distributed in foreign countries. Thousands of Teacher Instruction books and Visual Aid packages have also been printed and distributed. Thank you for helping make this happen.

Our immediate need is for funds to print the following student and teacher materials that have been prepared: 4,000 leaflets for the Philippines (\$4,500); 3,000 Primary cards (\$3,500) and 3,000 Preschool placemats (\$3,500) for the children in Myanmar; 3000 leaflets (\$3,500) for the children who speak Akha language in Southern China; and 12,000 leaflets (\$8,000) for the children in Africa.

Special thanks to Bethel MBC, Bethel, OK for their recent \$10,000 love offering which was immediately put to use in printing 18-week studies for 4,000 primary aged children and 8000 student journals for primary and intermediate children. What a great investment into the spiritual lives of so many children.

MORE U.S. CHURCHES USING CCfL. While our focus continues to be the translation and distribution of CCfL literature for children in foreign countries, we rejoice that children in 35 churches from 9 different states are learning about Jesus and Christian values using the Character Code for Life curriculum.

We had a Teacher-Training workshop on Wednesday. There were about 21 S u n d a y

School teachers. And they took around 150-180 Intermediate CCfL of two Modules, and about 120 Primary Materials, and 30 Teens and Adults materials. It was a success. Most of the trainees have already been teaching Sunday School for a few years; so, our ICP materials would be very helpful to them. Our Intermediate Module 1 is almost gone. I think, 200 copies are left. Thankfully, Preschool materials of both Modules are already in the hands of the printer. It will soon be ready.

We have been praying for you and your trip here. Please, pray for us as well. It has been a little tough for us as most of us in my family are not doing well. It has been going like that since last year. My mom is not doing no better. And my younger brother is not doing well also. We have doctor's appointment every week. My wife's second home, because of pregnancy, has been the hospital for about two months now. Thankfully, the baby is fine and is three months. Please, pray for us to be able to save money for our coming baby. We were told that it will cost around \$1,500, if the surgery is necessary. But without surgery, it will be about \$900. Please, do pray for us. Most of our money has been going to those doctors of my mom, my brother's and my wife's.

We miss you and are praying for you. We are very excited about seeing you and mom Rita. We have been praying for your safe trip here. We would like you, when you get here, to pray for our baby.

ARTIST'S SKETCHES OF PROPOSED ICP BUILDING IN THE PHILIPPINES



We are excited to have these drawings made by Eleine Abay, who will be the architect for the building.

Our prayer is to be able to break ground for the new building before the end of 2020 summer. We are praying that God will supply the remaining of just over ten thousand dollars to pay off the property loan and maybe a few

thousand dollars to begin work on the foundation of the new home for the ICP ministry in the Philippines.

These are the latest artist's concept of how the new building might look. The building will be three story, concrete and steel structure. The entry way will be on the left side of the bulding (top left). The ground floor (left 2) will provide for off-street parking, classrooms and print shop. The second floor



(right top) will be ICP offices and space to accomodate up to thirty children in IPC/His Offspring Children's Home. The third floor (bottom right) will be the assembly hall for Bible conferences and church worship.
