VOLCANO TAAL ASSERTS ITSELF!

A smoke and ash flume rises several miles above the volcanic island and is carried by the wind as far north as the capitol city of Manila. The eruption began in early January forcing thousands of Filipinos to evacuate along steep mountain roads, some unable to see the road becasue of the near zero visibility caused by the smoke from Taal.

December was a busy week for our Church. I went to a place called Ngwe Saung for a few days of preaching. It was a great blessing for me. After I came back, we had another evening preaching in one of our Church members' house. There were about 50 unbelievers present. got to share who Jesus, why He came into this world, and what He will do with this world and with us. After that, I went to the village where the ICP/Hope Children's Home is and taught them and the whole church about Christian life. There were about 30 people. We had Christmas with a few people from our church, but mostly focusing on our neighbors who are unbelievers. Some of them were very friendly to us. There were 13 unbelievers at that night. None claimed to believe in Jesus but all went back to their respective apartments having heard the good news of Jesus preached by our Pastor, Joshua. We plan to do some follow up slowly.




JACOB TUBAL, shows Sunday school teachers in Myanmar how to use the Character Code for Life curriculum.
