ICP MYANMAR

Serving the Lord with Gladness

Nestled between Thailand and Laos on the east, China to the north and India on the west, Myanmar is among the least developed countries in Southeast Asia. About the size of Texas, but twice the population density, Myanmar has become a major focus of ICP ministry.

In normal times, Paul Van Hre reaches out to the churches scattered throughout the country, training teachers and pastors to use ICP curriculum materials. However, the country is completely shut down because of the coronavirus. Churches and schools cannot meet, families must stay indoors except for trips to the doctor or to buy groceries. The people are unemployed, many are having difficulty finding food and shelter. But, Paul still finds opportunity to teach—especially the children of the ICP/Hope Children’s Home.

Jacob, whose first child was born in August, uses the time to help his wife recover from giving birth. He is learning that babies get their days and nights mixed up. Jacob is translating the *Character Code for Life* and *God’s Character and Me* materials into Burmese. He reports that materials for more than thirty thousand children have been printed. Two additional modules are ready and will be printed for distribution as soon as restrictions are relaxed.

In the far north, near the China border, translator Win Niang labors to translate the curriculum into his native language, Akha. The Akha people, nearly half a million in all, are scattered in small villages across the mountainous areas of northern Myanmar, western China and Thailand. He will soon begin the work of translating the new *Lord of Kings* VBS curriculum.

While other evangelical missions and missionaries work in Myanmar, formerly known as Burma, we believe the ministry of ICP, under the sponsorship of Calvary Missionary Baptist Church, Hamburg, Arkansas, is the only continuing mission effort of ABA churches in the country. Our hope is that God will enable us to reach the children of all the tribes in all the languages found in Myanmar with the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.
