Philippines

It is time for the annual trip to the Philippines. Rita and I left on May 11 and will return on June 1. While there we plan to attend three Bible Conferences, each followed by a distribution. We hope to distribute VBS and *Character Code for Life* study books to about two hundred churches. They will receive enough for a total of about twenty thousand children.

We will also have the special honor of officiating the wedding for Steven and Rebecca. Steven is there because of the fear of being drafted into the army of Myanmar (Burma), where he would have been used to fight against his own people. His brother Jacob will also attend the wedding. The wedding will conform to Filipino customs, be performed by an American and the bride and groom are both Falam Chin tribe people from Myanmar (Burma). Please pray for Steven and Rebecca as they begin their family under very unusual circumstances. Steven will stay on for at least one year to learn to operate the printing press so that when he returns to his home country, Myanmar, he will be a valuable part of the ICP ministry there.

Myanmar

Project Director for Myanmar, Jacob Tubal reports that he has distributed several hundred CCfL leaflets to Burmese children during the past month. He also finished his first semester of on-line studies at Texas Baptist Seminary. He is pursuing a Doctor of Ministry degree with a major in Christian education. Jacob is preparing to develop a Bible study curriculum especially for the churches in Myanmar.

Jacob will be in the Philippines in May to attend his brother's wedding and to visit the ICP/His Offspring Ministry building in the Philippines. We are happy to report that two churches have sent offerings of five thousand dollars each for the building fund in Myanmar. With this we can complete the foundation and get ready to move to the walls and roof of the planned three story building for ICP ministry in Myanmar. Please pray for this project that God will provide for this much needed building. It will enable Jacob to set up a printshop and to conduct training sessions to equip teachers of the churches to use the CCfL curriculum to enhance the spiritual growth of their members.

Kenya

Because the supply of *Character Code for Life* materials has been exhausted, Moses and Titus will print additional VBS literature for the churches. This will enable them to get the next module of CCfL literature translated and ready for distribution. They report a very successful twenty-six day trip to teach churches in the Rift Valley region of Kenya. Among

other things they conducted a joint VBS for four churches in the area. A total of seventy-five children attended.

They have also spent most of a month working on the translation of Module 3 of *God's Character and Me* curriculum, *The Value of a Godly Family* for teens and adults.

"The process has been good for us," Titus wrote. "We are learning a lot as we work through the material and think about how best to communicate it in our context."

Character Code for Life in the US

Character Code for Life lessons not only present the instructions of God's Word on over 30 godly values, it also challenges children to live out those moral truths, often in the classroom itself. On Wednesday, May 6, the younger primary children of **First Baptist Church, Cave City, Arkansas**, demonstrated the values of kindness, compassion, love and faith by praying over their classmate Kenna (picture 1). The next day Kenna would have an 8 hour surgery to address her severe scoliosis issues. Seven-year-old Kenna was so grateful for the prayers.



That evening, during the Closing Program, young people from the older primary class and Intermediate class continued to demonstrate the Christian values they had learned over the years from *Character Code for Life*. They showed courage, boldness, and initiative in sharing their testimony of faith in Christ (pictures 2 & 3). One new believer showed humility and gratitude by leading the congregation in prayer (picture 4). Seven of the nine young people saved in the past month have shown commitment, respect, and dedication by being baptized and becoming members of First Baptist Church. I was blessed to baptize the 4 Intermediate students (picture 5).

On May 6, **Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, Ashdown, Arkansas**, graduated 30 students after a year of Character Club. The ceremony was presented by the students consisting of Scripture songs, memorized verses and testimonies how God's character traits were influencing their daily lives. Throughout the school year, students met after school; most rode the school bus to the church. Students studied how Jesus and God the Father have character traits that should be seen in our lives. For three weeks, the same character trait was studied. Some of the traits were loyalty, respect, kindness, forgiveness, righteousness, and holiness. At least once a month for a part of the meeting, students enjoyed a bouncy house, weiner roast, animal balloons, frog hopping race, riding a buggy pulled by horses and other fun activities. A store where students could buy certain items from points they earned was motivating for the students. Many spiritual seeds were planted by God, culminating with at least one salvation experience. Students are already asking when we will begin again next school year.
